

<b>What information does the school need to provide to STOPit about my child?</b>	<p>To use the STOPit platform, only a very limited amount of student information will be needed, including the student's name, student ID and/or school email address. No additional personally identifiable information will be required. Both our school and STOPit are committed to protecting the privacy of student data. STOPit is a signatory to the Student Privacy Pledge, spearheaded by the Future of Privacy Forum and the Software &amp; Information Industry Association, and endorsed by President Obama.</p>
<b>Can the school find out who my child is through the STOPit app?</b>	<p>If a student chooses to make a report "anonymously," STOPit will not include any personal information about the student with the incident report. The school will see only that the report was submitted by an "anonymous user." Similarly, a student may use STOPit Messenger, which is always anonymous and marked as communication with an "anonymous user" to schools. When submitting a report anonymously or using STOPit Messenger, a student may choose to provide information that may allow the school to identify the student, at their discretion. If a student submits a report non-anonymously, the school will know that the report was submitted by them.</p>
<b>Can STOPit be used by children under the age of 13?</b>	<p>The STOPit app (and its browser-based version) may be used by children under the age of 13. We urge parents to contact the school's administration to learn more about how the school uses STOPit and the data we provide them.</p>
<b>Who receives the reports my child submits via STOPit?</b>	<p>In most cases the school will set up a group of report managers to receive all reports submitted via STOPit. Students may also choose to send reports to Trusted Contacts whom they add to their STOPit mobile app.</p>
<b>What is a Trusted Contact and who should my child program as one?</b>	<p>A Trusted contact is a person in your child's life whom you trust and who will be supportive to them if your child experiences a problem or needs help. Trusted contacts can be a parents, guardians, coaches, teachers, or other trusted, responsible adults.</p>
<b>If my child includes a Trusted Contact on their report what will they receive?</b>	<p>If your child chooses to send a report to one or more Trusted Contacts, STOPit will send an e-mail and/or text message to the individual(s) with a link that allows them to view the full content of your child's report.</p>
<b>How will someone be alerted if my child makes them a Trusted Contact?</b>	<p>When a child adds a Trusted Contact in the STOPit mobile app, STOPit will send them an e-mail informing them of such. They will also be given the opportunity to "opt out" of being a Trusted Contact.</p>
